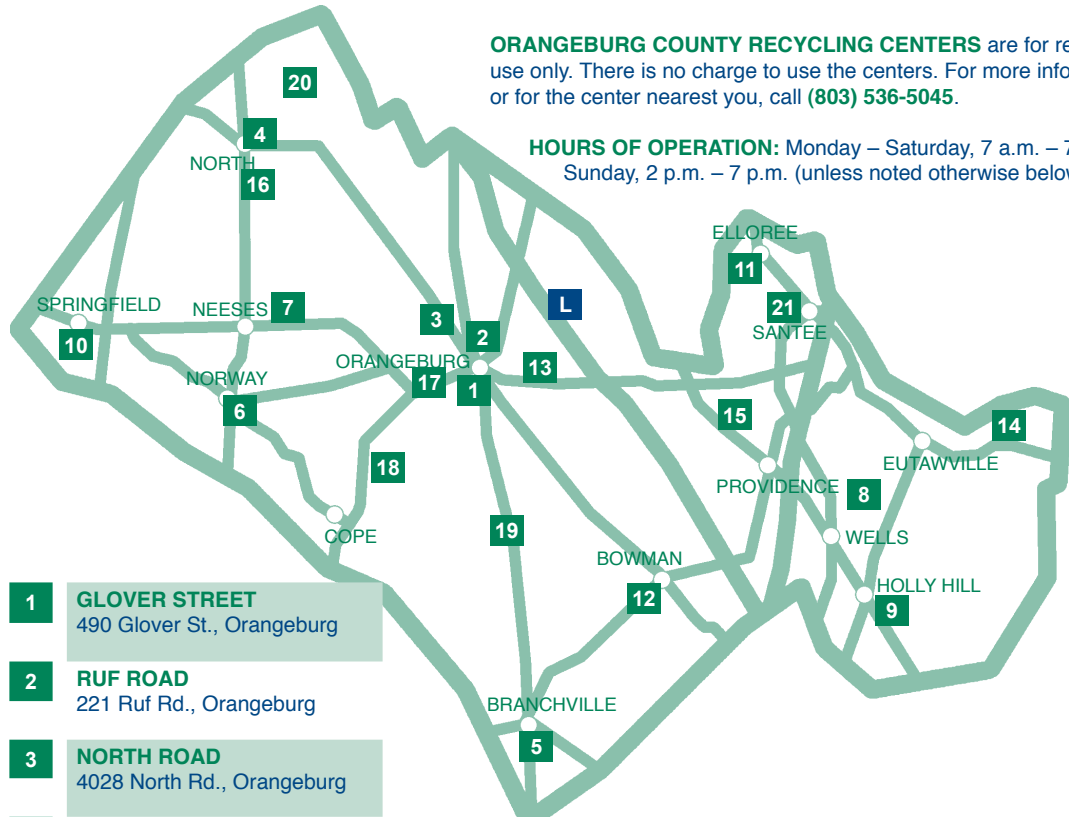

## Why recycle?

### TO SAVE NATURAL RESOURCES

- For each ton of recycled glass used to make new glass, nine gallons of fuel are saved.
- When paper is made from recycled fibers, 58 percent less water is used – compared to making paper from raw materials.

### TO SAVE ENERGY

- One aluminum can saves enough energy to power a television set for one hour.
- Two gallons of used motor oil has enough energy to power the average home for 24 hours.

### TO SAVE LANDFILL SPACE

- It cost tax payers millions of dollars to construct new landfills. The less that goes into a landfill, the longer it will last.

## Reduce, Reuse, Recycle!

- **REDUCE** the amount of waste you make.
- **REUSE** as many products and packages as possible.
- **RECYCLE** every possible material.

To complete the recycling process, **BUY RECYCLED** products and those packaged in recycle material.

### ITEMS ACCEPTED FOR RECYCLING IN ORANGEBURG COUNTY

ITEM	WHAT TYPES OF ITEMS?	HOW TO PREPARE THEM?	WHERE TO RECYCLE THEM?
<b>ALUMINUM CANS</b>	Food and beverage cans	Rinse and flatten.	All Recycling Centers
<b>APPLIANCES (WHITE GOODS)</b>	See SCRAP METAL	See SCRAP METAL	
<b>BATTERIES, LEAD-ACID</b>	Batteries from automobiles, boats, motorcycles, lawn mowers, etc.		All Recycling Centers
<b>CARDBOARD</b>	Corrugated cardboard boxes (no wax finish) and paper bags; NO pizza boxes; NO paperboard boxes (e.g., cereal boxes, shoe boxes, etc.)	Flatten. Keep items dry.	All Recycling Centers
<b>COOKING OIL</b>			All Recycling Centers
<b>FARMER OIL</b>	Oil from farm equipment	Limit 55 gallons per visit.	Landfill
<b>GASOLINE/OIL MIXTURES</b>		Limit 5 gallons per visit.	Five Chop Road Recycling Center
<b>GLASS</b>	Clear, green and brown glass bottles and jars. Window glass, drinking glasses, pottery, porcelain and china ARE NOT accepted.	Rinse. Labels do not have to be removed.	All Recycling Centers
<b>NEWSPAPER AND INSERTS</b>	Newspapers and glossy inserts; carbon paper or partially burned paper IS NOT accepted.	DO NOT tie or bag. Keep items dry.	All Recycling Centers
<b>PLASTIC BOTTLES AND JARS</b>	Plastic containers (for food, beverage, household products, etc.) marked by a #1 or #2 recycling symbol; NO tubs, bags, film or Styrofoam	Rinse. Discard lids and caps. NOTE: Plastic pesticide containers that have been TRIPLE-RINSED are accepted at the Springfield Recycling Center.	All Recycling Centers
<b>SCRAP METAL</b>	Appliances, stoves, washers and dryers, refrigerators, grills, bicycles, etc.)		All Recycling Centers
<b>TEXTILES</b>	Clothing, shoes, belts, purses, hats, towels, linens and blankets	Keep items clean and dry.	All Recycling Centers
<b>USED MOTOR OIL, OIL BOTTLES AND OIL FILTERS</b>	Used motor oil, filters and bottles (oil must be free of gasoline or diesel fuel) and other petroleum products (see list on the right)	Limit five gallons per visit.	All Recycling Centers
<b>YARD TRIMMINGS</b>	Small tree branches, leaves, Christmas trees, etc.	Limbs must be no more than 4 feet long and 8 inches in diameter.	All Recycling Centers

## Recycle used motor oil, bottles & filters!

Used motor oil, oil filters and empty motor oil bottles frequently are disposed of improperly. One gallon of used motor oil poured on the ground or in a sewer system can contaminate as much as 1 million gallons of water – often the very water we drink.

To make proper disposal easy and convenient, containers for used motor oil, oil filters and oil bottles can be found at recycling centers throughout Orangeburg County.

## Waste not, PAY NOT!

You pay only for the electricity, gas and water services you use. Why should garbage service be any different.

Thousands of communities across the country have a new system to pay for garbage pickup and disposal. This system is call variable rate pricing or **PAY-AS-YOU-THROW** (PAYT).

PAYT is a system that charges residents for garbage services based on the amount of waste they throw away. This system is fair and puts you in control of how much you spend on garbage disposal.
