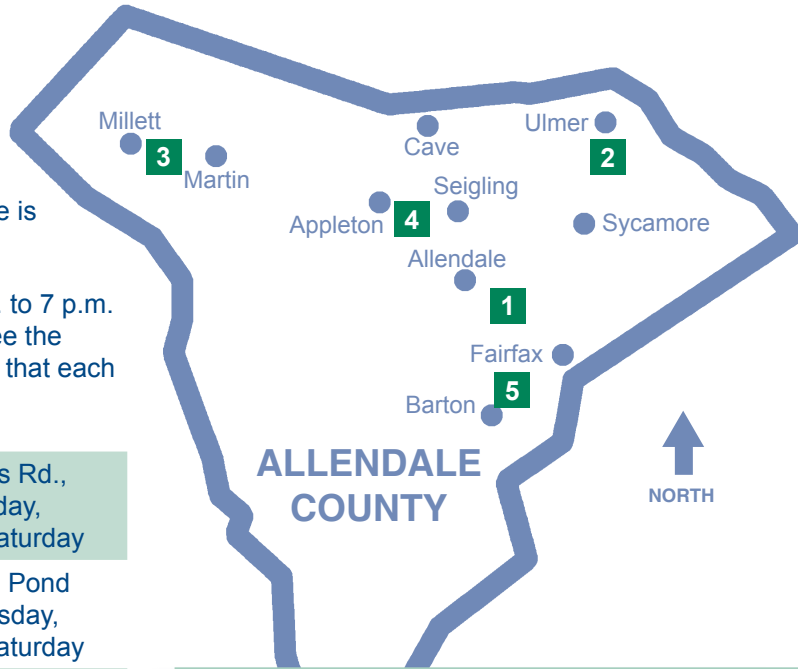


Allendale County Recycling Centers

- 3 MARTIN**, 7601 Augusta Hwy., Martin; OPEN: Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday
- 4 APPLETON**, 506 Gill Rd., Allendale; OPEN: Monday, Wednesday, Friday and Saturday
- 5 BARTON**, 1485 Terry Rd., Fairfax; OPEN: Monday, Wednesday, Friday and Saturday

Backyard Composting

Garden and landscape debris, such as leaves and grass clippings, account for up to 20 percent of the waste disposed. Obviously, it makes sense to mulch or compost. Through these processes organic trimmings can be recycled and used in landscape design and gardens.

Leaves, garden residue and kitchen scraps can be turned into a valuable soil additive. When mixed with soil, compost increases organic content, improves the physical properties of the soil and supplies essential nutrients that enhance the soil's ability to support plant growth.

Recycle used motor oil, filters, bottles and more!

The following petroleum products **ARE ACCEPTED** and may be put into the used motor oil collection tank in small quantities:

- motor oil;
- hydraulic fluid;
- gear oil;
- diesel fuel;
- fuel oil;
- kerosene;
- automatic transmission fluid; and
- power steering fluid.

The following petroleum products **CANNOT BE PLACED** in the used motor oil collection tank:

- antifreeze;
- Varsol;
- brake fluid;
- paint (oil and latex);
- paint thinner;
- refrigeration oil; and
- any solvent cleaners or substance to clean paint brushes.

OIL FILTERS MUST BE DRAINED. Allow 24 hours for oil to drain completely from the filter.

ALUMINUM CANS	Aluminum beverage cans and scrap aluminum	Rinse beverage containers, cans and pans.	Allendale and Sycamore Centers
APPLIANCES AND SCRAP METAL	All appliances with metal parts including stoves, washers, dryers, bicycles, refrigerators, grills, etc. Computers and televisions ARE NOT recycled.	Please see the attendant on duty for instructions.	All Recycling Centers
BATTERIES, LEAD-ACID	Used automotive, marine and lawn mower batteries	Please see the attendant on duty for instructions.	All Recycling Centers
CARDBOARD	Cardboard; NO Styrofoam or plastic	Flatten.	All Recycling Centers
FARMER OIL	Motor oil from farm equipment	Please limit 55 gallons per visit.	Allendale, Barton and Sycamore Recycling Centers
GLASS	Clear, green and brown glass bottles and jars ARE accepted; mirrors, light bulbs, Pyrex and crystal ARE NOT accepted.	Remove lids and rinse.	Allendale and Sycamore Recycling Centers
NEWSPAPERS AND INSERTS	Dry newspapers; NO paper towels or food wrappings	Keep dry. DO NOT tie or bag.	Allendale and Sycamore Recycling Centers
OIL/GASOLINE MIXTURE	Mixtures of motor oil and gasoline	Please see the attendant on duty for instructions.	Allendale Recycling Center
PLASTIC BOTTLES	Plastic beverage bottles, jars and jugs; Look for the recycling arrows (with a #1 or #2) on the bottom of these containers.	Remove caps and lids. Rinse. DO NOT remove labels. Plastic bags and film ARE NOT accepted.	Allendale and Sycamore Recycling Centers
TIRES	Passenger car and truck tires	Limit 12 tires per visit. Off-road tires ARE NOT accepted.	All Recycling Centers
USED MOTOR OIL, BOTTLES AND FILTERS		Transport in a tightly sealed container. Oil MUST be free of diesel fuel.	All Recycling Centers

Recycle used motor oil!

Used motor oil, oil filters and empty motor oil bottles are frequently improperly disposed of. One gallon of used motor oil poured on the ground or in a sewer system can contaminate as much as 1 million gallons of water – often the very water we drink.

To make recycling easy and convenient, all Allendale County Recycling Centers accept used motor oil, oil filters and oil bottles for recycling. In addition, farmer oil and oil/gasoline mixture are accepted at some sites. Check the table on the left for specific information.

Why recycle?

- **TO SAVE NATURAL RESOURCES**
 - 58 percent less water is used to make recycled paper than when using raw materials.
- **TO SAVE ENERGY**
 - Recycling one aluminum can saves enough energy to run a television for three hours.
 - Two gallons of recycled motor oil have enough energy to run the average household for 24 hours.
- **TO SAVE LANDFILL SPACE**
 - Landfills are expensive to build and maintain. Why put recyclables in the landfill? Save valuable landfill space.
